Reports Filed: Reports were filed today as follows: H.R. 1450, to amend the Agricultural Act of 2014 to modify the treatment of revenue from timber sale contracts and certain payments made by counties to the Secretary of Agriculture and the Secretary of the Interior under good neighbor agreements, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 118–168, Part 1);

H.R. 1435, to amend the Clean Air Act to prevent the elimination of the sale of internal combustion engines (H. Rept. 118–169);

H.R. 3836, to facilitate direct primary care arrangements under Medicaid, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–170);

H.R. 4468, to prohibit the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency from finalizing, implementing, or enforcing a proposed rule with respect to emissions from vehicles, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 118–171);

H.R. 4469, to clarify that eRINs are not authorized for purposes of satisfying the volume of renewable fuel that needs to be contained in transportation fuel for purposes of the Renewable Fuel Program, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 118–172);

H.R. 1547, to direct the Secretary of Transportation to conduct a study on the costs and benefits of commuter rail passenger transportation involving

transfers, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–173);

H.R. 2988, to provide for Department of Energy and National Aeronautics and Space Administration research and development coordination, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–174);

H.R. 4143, to amend the National Construction Safety Team Act to enable the National Institute of Standards and Technology to investigate structures other than buildings to inform the development of engineering standards, best practices, and building codes related to such structures, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 118–175);

H.R. 4671, to amend the Small Business Act to standardize reporting on procurement goals for small business concerns, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 118–176);

H.R. 4090, to amend the Federal Fire Prevention and Control Act of 1974 to authorize appropriations for the United States Fire Administration and fire-fighter assistance grant programs, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 118–177);

H.R. 369, to require the National Institute of Standards and Technology to conduct research on public safety communication coordination standards among wildland firefighters and fire management response officials, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–178);

H.R. 4670, to amend the Small Business Act to require reporting on additional information with respect to small business concerns owned and controlled by women, qualified HUBZone small business concerns, and small business concerns owned

and controlled by veterans, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 118–179);

H.R. 3995, to require the Administrator of the Small Business Administration to ensure that the small business regulatory budget for a fiscal year is not greater than zero, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–180);

H.R. 4480, to require the Administrator of the Small Business Administration to report on the veterans interagency task force, to require the Comptroller General of the United States to report on access to credit for small business concerns owned and controlled by covered individuals, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 118–181);

H.R. 4666, to require the Inspector General of the Small Business Administration to submit a quarterly report on fraud relating to certain COVID–19 loans (H. Rept. 118–182);

H.R. 4669, to provide for Department of Energy, National Laboratories, and Small Business Administration joint research and development activities, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 118–183, Part 1);

H.R. 4667, to require the Administrator of the Small Business Administration to issue guidance and rules for lenders and the Small Business Administration on handling amounts of Paycheck Protection Loans returned by borrowers, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 118–184); and

H.R. 4668, to amend the Small Business Act to require the Small Business and Agriculture Regulatory Enforcement Ombudsman to publish guidance documents for certain rules, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 118–185).
